
Please remember to bring serving utensils, your own plates, and eating utensils.

## Making a Difference:

Many of you have participated in the multitude of events we have had the last couple of years that have put the club out in the community helping to Make a Difference. We would like to continue this tradition and expand our efforts.

Last spring, a committee was formed to review the use of our Heritage Funds. They advised the original intent of attaining a building to still be the goal, and to be aggressively campaigned over 5 years.

The committee also recognized that many members would like to find alternative uses of the funds, and recommended the use of \$1,000 or no more than 50% of the total contributions to the fund each year, be used for opportunities of Charitable funding to 3 categories of giving:

- Education
- Community
- Promotion

To these means, the Board is looking for members to participate on a committee to achieve the goal of a building. Is a building achievable? We need people to seriously look at the possibility and to do a study of what it will take to acquire or build a building the club can call its own. What will it take to

maintain and what kind of revenue stream will be required to afford to keep it. We are one year into this project and have not gotten any traction on this yet. The Board, thru the Budget and Finance committee, has budgeted \$500 from Operational Funds to go to special requests for charitable funding. These monies are separate from the Heritage Fund and are for special requests of charity presented by our Membership. The committee will also explore opportunities in the 3 categories identified by the Heritage Fund committee for specific dollar amount donations.

Your chance is now to get involved and Make a Difference. Let your voice be heard and get involved this year to participate in the IAC's Charitable activities and to help direct to whom we give.
